

ART SPECIAL:

/ WORDSTONES, SPOOKY SOUNDS IN THE CLASSROOM, AND A CHILDREN'S HIGH-RISE

Let yourself be carried away on a cultural adventure that will be taking place from April 22-25 in the northern part of the Cologne City Centre! Follow the ART SPECIAL: course and you will encounter many different forms of art around the whole Klingelpützpark, both inside and outside six individual educational establishments. You will be guided by a blue and red Ariadne's thread through this art landscape. The artistic statements represent the outcome of collaborations between twenty musicians, writers, fine artists, and 300 students from six educational establishments that have all joined forces to create "Bildungslandschaft Altstadt Nord"

The Hansa-Gymnasium may be the starting point. Unusual sounds and noises on the first floor immediately entice one to the sites and spheres of reflection, replete with animated and still images alike, as well as Literary Rooms, which one can perambulate and which can be experienced with a number of different senses. Only those of you who listen very carefully will hear acoustic indicators as to the next stops on the route. Before that however, perhaps the visitor would care to treat his or her taste buds to something special in the Bistro. After that, the route takes the visitor past meteorites that crop up again

and again all along the way. Even in the Klingelpütz youth centre, there is plenty to see and hear: music, rhymes and rhyming, non-rhymes and nonrhyming, short audio plays. Anyone who wants to give a speech can climb onto a stone and speak. Incidentally, ART SPECIAL: provides an additional six spots where this is possible. One's sense of hearing is continually put to the test during the tour—in the park. too, on the way to the Tower, from whose viewing platform extraordinary vistas open up. Immediately opposite the shared site of the Primary and Junior High Schools, an unusual building attracts one's attention from afar in the school playground: either be guided by the magenta-coloured line into the interior of the Junior High School to see the images and sounds of a film and witness the performance of both students and visitors, or proceed to the Primary School and marvel at the mighty sculpture in the hallway, at silhouettes of the primary pupils in the Literary Room, and at instruments of a special nature. The last stop on the ART SPECIAL: course might be the Abendaymnasium or Night School, the reflectory of which having been styled along artistic lines. The Literary Room here offers acoustic, as well as visual experiences with critical undertones. Right at the end, images and sounds culminate in a virtual excursion far beyond the houndaries of the educational and art landscape of the Cologne City Centre

This project, rooted in close collaboration both with prominent artists as well as students, is being held in 2010 for the fifth time—up to now it has been staged at the Hansa-Gymnasium a participating institution in the UNESCO Associated Schools Project Network (ASPnet) and has been called Art Special: Hansa. Its maanificent inauauration in 1996 made thematic as well as spatial reference to the school as a public space. In the following year, performance and music were the key disciplines and, in 1998, coinciding with the 50th anniversary of the UN Declaration of Human Rights, the project focused upon corresponding issues. The project then expanded into different sites of the local art culture in order to create a network between the Hansa-Gymnasium and the internationally renowned art scene in Cologne, very much in keeping with UNESCO's strateav of networking. The Art Special: Hansa editions from 1996 until 1998 were funded as research projects by the Federal Ministry for Education, Research. and Technology, as well as by several other public foundations and sponsors. In keeping with this, the 2006 version of the event was geared towards the inherent internationality of the region itself. For the first time, Art Special: Hansa invited writers alongside the artists and musicians, who duly stirred up the world of school for a while. All five editions of this art project, curated by Uta M. Reindl and Georg Dietzler, have only been made possible by means of the colossal engagement on the part of the teachers

and parents alike. The artists always have students at their side as patrons and assistants; the students decided before the project began upon the groups of artists from which they will make their choices, subsequently to become their assistants for a fixed period.

ART SPECIAL: 2010 has been made possible by the Bonn founder Carl Richard Montag as a sponsor of the experimental model "Bildungslandschaft Altstadt Nord" situated in the northern part of the Cologne City Centre.

Some of them were used as large-format wall paintings that Peter Zimmermann (b. 1959) has developed in close collaboration with student sponsors from the Hansa-Gymnasium and the Abendgymnasium. The work serves as a link to the final stop on the ART SPECIAL: route.

Alexander Basile (b.1981) took sixth form students on art historical excursions through museums and galleries in the region before helping them turn their attention to the school building itself. It was there that the media artist produced films with the students, reflecting upon the world within the school. The outcome: video installations, in which visitors can play a role alongside the participating young people.

In the extraordinarily constructed criminal and historical novel by the Catalan writer, Jaume Cabré (b. 1947), the Pyrenean river Pamano connects the events of the Franco regime with those of present day Spain. It dominates the literary room designed by students and teachers; it divides the ghosts of the past that the novelist conjures up for us.

UNTITLED

A screeching, ratcheting sound, and rattling fills the school's art classroom, which the composer, creator of objects, and inventor Erwin Stache (b. 1960) has transformed into an unusual sonic environment together with Year 5 and 6 pupils. Everyday items, as well as objects from the school itself, are brought to life by the pupils and staged with cryptic wit.

Anybody paying attention when negotiating the stairways of the Hansa-Gymnasiums will become aware of a stream of voices inviting them to make surprising discoveries in the Klingelpütz Park. This is the result of some experimental sonic research conducted by students in conjunction with musicians and radio artists, author Sarah Washington (b. 1965) and Knut Aufermann (b. 1972).

The sculptor Thomas Rentmeister (b. 1956) has turned his back on the standard, traditional materials favoured by his fellow craftsmen and women, modelling sculptures out of Nutella instead, or plying refrigerators with Penaten cream to create larger-than-life sculptural works. In a similar way, the artist breaks with the tradition of the relief by making a mural sculpture made from cotton buds, make-up remover, and tooth brushes, everything white on white! Rentmeister's student sponsors chose a selection of utensils from daily life, which were then arranged on a board and now adorn the corridor wall in the Hansa-Gymnasium.

The temperature of the space is undeniably cool, as is the dystopian world of Juli Zeh's Corpus Delicti-irgendwann im 21. Jahrhundert (Corpus Delicti—At some point during the 21st Century). Brought back to the present by sixth formers and their course director, the idea of this distant place is developed in the classroom. Very much in keeping with the author's (b. 1974) vision, who is also well known for the musical interpretation of her books, the action of the novel will be animated by performances and music instigated collectively by Juli Zeh and the students.

Hörzelle (Listening cell) a sound installation for a cellar was inspired by the rich history of the place. All of the audio plays can be heard in a moderated performance.

The universe is located in the northern part of the Cologne Old Town. Proof of this is provided by the gigantic meteorite on the way to the next stop along the route. Throughout the tour of the art landscape, visitors will come into contact with other heavenly bodies that Agnes Meyer-Brandis (b. 1973) has brought to the exhibition together with the children and young people from the Klingelpütz youth centre.

A parking meter clock that happily doesn't require you to supply any small change if you want to tarry awhile, makes a walk through Klingelpütz Park an acoustic reconnaissance mission, as well as a subtle listening experience. And this happens on the hour from the opening evening onwards until the exhibition is over. The sonic cosmos was created by students in conjunction with the musicians and radio artists S. Washington (b. 1965) and K. Aufermann (b. 1972).

The composer and performance artist hans w. koch (b. 1962), who is renowned for his occasionally quirky performances with everyday electronic gadgets, created this decidedly unusual sonic universe in conjunction with the Primary School pupils.

Peter Zimmermann (b. 1959) enlarged wellknown motifs in his early paintings: large-format canvases offering up the cover of the Langenscheidt dictionary for example, or those of the Diercke World Atlases. In the murals with the students. Zimmermann has recourse to another of his early strategies, namely that of transferring a variety of templates in a distorted way into painting. However, at the night school, the decidedly individual secret life of exercise and school textbooks is duly revealed on the walls of the cafeteria—namely, in the shape of extremely enlarged doodles drawn by students!

CRISIS

Kathrin Röggla (b. 1971) gets to grips with the idea of the place itself as the embodiment of a new orientation per se and had students from both the Hansa-Gymnasium and Night School conduct one hour interviews with individuals from the school's neighborhhood about the current crisis affecting all of us: teachers, students in young offenders institutions taught by teachers from the Night School, a banker, and a cathedral vicar. Tellingly, the students of both establishments, in conjunction with the author, set up the multimedia space in passageway in order to make the crisis perceptible—to the eye and the ear—as a temporary, transitional phenomenon.
